

From the Commissioner

The budget season is underway and I have had the opportunity to address the Joint Appropriations Subcommittee on Natural and Economic Resources overseeing our budget on two separate occasions thus far. Last week, I addressed the governor's proposed budget and used that opportunity to remind NER members that while I understand the reality

of our state's budget situation, to please take into consideration the fact that our department has taken its fair share of cuts over the years.

I reminded the members that the N.C. Department of Labor has not received, nor have we asked for, any new state money since 2008probably not something many state agencies can say-and that since 2009, we have seen our appropriation reduced by more than \$4 million. Considering that our current funding is about \$16 million, this is a substantial hit. If you look at where we started four years ago versus where we are now, our budget has shrunk to less than 85 percent of what it was.

I take pride in the fact that we operate on one of the leanest budgets in state government; but at some point if the cuts continue, it will affect our ability to carry out our jobs. I will keep you posted on any new developments as the budget process continues.

I'd like to thank those of you who greeted Lt. Gov. Dan Forest during his recent visit to both the Labor and Old Revenue buildings. Lt. Gov. Forest has been visiting many state offices to gain a better understanding of the state government system and to thank employees for their service to the state. I am pleased that he is taking an interest in learning about our department so that he can better help us accomplish our goals.

The Annual Report is now available online. I look forward to sharing our accomplishments with the public and I would like to thank each of you for your role in carrying out our overall mission. Whether your function is behind the scenes or on the front lines, what you do matters and what we do collectively is very important work. Please take a minute to review the report here.
