From the Commissioner

The department is adopting a new NCDOL Copyright Compliance Policy, which takes effect June 1. All employees must read and sign the policy and return it to their supervisors by June 14.

The purpose of the policy is to provide a summary of U.S. copyright law, particularly as it relates to the use of other people's copyright-protected materials and to provide guidelines for obtaining copyright permission. As you may know, we recently experienced at least two instances of inadvertent misuse of copyrighted images resulting in penalties. The guidelines set forth in the policy must be used consistently throughout NCDOL to eliminate incurring additional copyright infringement penalties.

In a nutshell, grabbing images or photos from the Internet is not an option unless you seek permission from the copyright holder. The department is working to establish an NCDOL Photo Library that will contain only approved photos that can be used in presentations and brochures. Anne Weaver is in charge of the photos for the OSH Division, and Mike Daniels is in charge of the photos for Standards and Inspections and Administration.

Should you have other questions after reading the policy, do not hesitate to contact Dolores Quesenberry in Communications. Please be familiar with the policy as you prepare your presentations on behalf of NCDOL.
