We will begin the month of February with the Agricultural Safety and Health Bureau's 22nd Annual Gold Star Grower's Luncheon scheduled for Wednesday, Feb. 3, at the N.C. State Fairgrounds in Raleigh.

Regina Cullen developed the Gold Star Grower Program in 1992 to recognize growers in our state whose housing for migrant workers exceeds the requirements of the Migrant Housing Act. More than two decades later, the program has never been stronger.

It is always a pleasure for me to attend the luncheon and help Regina and her staff recognize the growers in North Carolina who have achieved Gold Star status. On Wednesday, we will recognize 285 growers who met the requirements of the program in 2015. One benefit for the growers who qualify for the program by being 100 percent in compliance two consecutive years is that they are able to self-inspect their migrant housing the following year. When the growers are eligible to self-inspect, it frees up our staff to focus our efforts on the housing that needs more attention.

We should all take a little pride in knowing that this program ensures those who hand-picked much of the produce we buy at produce stands and grocery stores across our state had respectable living quarters to return to at the end of the workday. This is yet another example of how the work we do touches the lives of workers and citizens each day in North Carolina.

Puckett Award 2015

Larry Watts received the Puckett Award at the Agricultural Safety and Health Bureau's staff meeting on Jan. 21. In 2008, ASH established the annual Everett Puckett award in memory of a former ASH employee, who died unexpectedly at the age of 41. During his 10 years working for ASH, Everett conducted the majority of the agricultural related fatality inspections; was a much requested speaker at various agricultural related meetings; and was a very well regarded, thoughtful member of the ASH team.

So what's the Puckett Award really mean? It means that if you earn it, you've gone above and beyond. Without complaining, on your own initiative,
